

### About LPW's Recovery & Recovery Plus Programmes

LPW's Recovery Programme is a new initiative that is designed to work collaboratively with mainstream schools, both primary and secondary, across Bristol to support with helping children and young people to re-engage positively with education and reduce exclusions.

We recognise that children and young people achieve best when they have access to a broad and balanced curriculum offer and our new packages of support will enable them to continue to access this throughout their school careers, while also supporting schools to re-engage their most vulnerable students.

The Recovery and Recovery Plus programmes align with the recommendations of the recently published green paper, Right Support, Right Place, Right Time and support schools to put in place a graduated response of individuals tailored to individual children and young people.

Available across Key Stages 1 – 5 the programmes are staffed by LPW experts with vast experience of supporting children and young people that have experienced childhood trauma and a high number of Adverse Childhood Experiences. Combining the skillsets of LPW School teaching staff and engagement workers allows us to offer knowledge and experience of both in-school barriers to engagement and strategies to support successful achievement as well as community based factors that impact on young people and strategies to support them when not in school.

Both programmes recognise the importance of a combined approach:

- In school interventions – this offers the child or young person tailored support within their mainstream setting that ensures they are not removed from their education setting and works to maintain and rebuild relationships with staff and peers where problems have previously arisen.
- Community intervention – it is often external factors that influence a child or young person's ability to engage positively with their education and LPW has a wealth of expertise at working with individuals and families to support them in their locality.
- Vocational provision – for many children and young people the opportunity to develop skills in a particular area of interest acts as the springboard to educational engagement. We work with our partners to secure opportunities for individuals to put their skills to use in a range of active learning opportunities.

All of our programmes can be tailored to meet the particular circumstances and need of individual children and young people.
